What Do You Need to Buy?

You need a LiveScribe pen. There are several. The main difference between them is the internal memory. The longer you expect your notes to be, the more GBs you need. I suggest 4GB. You do NOT want to record examples longer than 3-5 minutes (at most).

There is a new LiveScribe3 pen that works with Apple tablets and phones (iOS) though Android support is coming in late 2014. If you want to use the application for tablets/phones, you might consider the new pen. The recordings you make work fine on Android, etc. now this just relates to using the LiveScribe application for editing, etc. on these devices rather than simply watching the final product.

You also need the LiveScribe special paper the pen requires. The \$199 4GB pen starter pack includes 50 sheets. You use one page per example as LiveScribe saves by the page used.

Fry's tend to have these pens and paper for a bit less than the online store,

A Summary of the Steps Needed to Make LiveScribe Presentations

The LiveScribe guide that comes with the pen is VERY easy to follow so I am not repeating that information here. Instead, I am just summarizing the steps.

1. Connect your LiveScribe pen to a WiFi network (UTA works fine)
2. Click "rec" on the LiveScribe blank page and start your work
3. When finished, click "stop" and the pen will automatically upload your work to Evernote. You will see "syncing" message on the pen LED.

4. Login to your Evernote account and you will see the new page. Click on it you will see a menu on upper right including "share." Click share and choose your option (I usually use "link").

5. Copy the link/URL and then paste into your BlackBoard course as an item or URL. I usually do as an item as you can describe it. A student does NOT need an Evernote account to view the example.
