
Copyright: What it means

Copyright was instituted to "encourage learning and "promote the progress of science and the useful arts NOT

to protect the rights of the author

Scriptural Scribes 20 000 years

Amazon applies its own DRM to Kindle eBooks, and they completely control the system



Apple applies its FairPlay DRM to all files purchased from the iBookstore



Adobe's DRM system, called Adobe **Digital Editions Protection Technology** (ADEPT) uses a program called Adobe Content Server 4 (ACS4) to manage DRM
